Home Video

Just like most modern technological inventions, video cameras have improved in quality since they first became available to the public.

The video recorder was invented by Sony in 1965 and nearly a decade later, in 1974, the same company brought out the Handy Cam. This camera, which used VHS video tapes, cost about £1,500. As more and more manufacturers began to make video cameras, the tapes became smaller and prices fell. Today approximately 250,000 camcorders, which can be bought for as little as £300, are sold in the UK every year.

Even though they are popular, video cameras do not allow the person doing the filming to join in the fun. Now a solution to this problem has been found. A video camera weighing less than 90g has been developed. It can easily fit on the frame of a pair of sunglasses with the recorder clipped on to a belt. It also has a special feature which prevents the picture from jumping as the wearer is moving.

This technology may have applications in the field of medicine. With an audio-video link, it will allow surgeons to carry out operations with instructions down a telephone line from a specialist who could be thousands of miles away.
