Inuit – The Native People of Canada

Canada is home to a quarter of the world's population of Inuit, who are the Eskimos living in small communities in the north of Canada. Modern technologies have made life easier for the Inuit. Transportation and communication have been improved. The traditional dog team has largely been replaced by snowmobiles, cars and trucks. And the igloo has mostly been replaced by houses with central heating and electricity.

But modern life has also brought problems with it. Some Inuit feel that their culture is in danger of being lost and forgotten.

Carol Geddes, an Inuit working nurse in Ottawa, tells us about her experience at school. "I was sent to a school which was 300 miles south of my home. During the whole 10-month school year I had little communication with my parents. I was grateful that we could return home at least each spring and summer so that I could see what life was like in my village. Today my children go to a local school and are taught in our language and in English, too. I think this is very important for us. We, the native people, know that we can only survive if we save our beliefs and traditions. I would like my children not only to have the tools to survive in the Arctic, but also to be able to compete for jobs anywhere in Canada or in the world."
